From the Principal...

24 Hour Industrial Action - Parents would have received a note home yesterday outlining the industrial action which will take place tomorrow Wednesday 27 June. Please be aware that students who do not attend school tomorrow are required to bring a note explaining the reason for their absence.

Term Dates - A reminder for all parents that Term 2 ends on Friday 29 June. Term 3 commences for students on Tuesday 17 July. Please be aware that Monday 16 July is a professional learning day for staff.

Thank You - A huge thank you to the large number of parents who have attended parent teacher interviews over the last two weeks. It is a real credit to our community to see parents interested and involved in their child's learning and progress. The conversations between teachers and parents ensure a partnership with learning but also strengthen the home-school links and demonstrate the high value placed on learning and education. The feedback from parents about interviews and the school report have been overwhelmingly positive.

2012 School Contribution Levy - There are still a large number of families who have not paid the school contribution levy. This levy is used to provide additional resources and programs for our students K-6. Our school provides all students with access to computers and printers in every classroom as well as additional art and craft resources, supply of books, cardboard and additional consumables. In 2012 the voluntary contribution component is being used for the upkeep and maintenance of existing air conditioning units across the school as well as the maintenance and running of the interactive whiteboards in every classroom. Parents are asked to return their school contribution levy as soon as possible. Without this support from the community we may no longer be able to run, repair or replace air conditioning across the school.

CARS and STARS - Parents are asked to finalise the \$5 payment for students CARS and STARS comprehension text books. These books are used as part of classroom programs and activities. We are asking parents to finalise these payments as soon as possible so students can start using these books.

School Car Park - Parents are reminded that the staff car park is not an area to drop off students in the morning or collect students in the afternoon. Our car park has limited space considering the large number of staff we have here at Governor Philip King. We are requesting that parents do not drive into the school in the morning or the afternoon. The safety of our students is our number one priority. Parents driving in and out of the car park pose a significant risk to both students and parents using the pedestrian access.

Student and Family Information - We request that parents inform the front office of any changes to contact details which may occur over the holiday period. This includes home and mobile numbers. If there have been any changes with family situations, including custody arrangements, we request that you notify the school as soon as possible.
