We have had a great start to Term 4 with our students coming back settled after the holiday break. In what has been a crazy year it is hard to believe that we are in the final term of 2020. We are getting ready to welcome our new Kindergarten students as part of our Orientation program over the next few weeks, and at the same time planning and preparing to farewell our Year 6 students in only 7 weeks time.

#### Important Information Regarding Orientation Visits

Due to Covid 19, the Department of Education has placed strict guidelines on how schools can operate their Kindergarten Orientation Program. Only one parent/carer can bring their child onto the school grounds. Upon entering the school, all parents/carers must register by providing their name, email address and contact phone number. They will need to sanitise their hands as well as their child's hands. Parents/carers are only permitted to take their child to their allocated room and must leave the school grounds within ten minutes. Only one parent/carer can collect their child at the end of the session. Please ensure you collect your child at 10:30am. Access to the school will be available through the Allambie Road entry gates only. Staff will be available to show you where to take your child for each session. Note: If you or your child are unwell or have any flu like symptoms, please do not enter the school.

Don't forget to return your Information about your Child for 2021 note and your Intention to Return to GPK in 2021. These notes were sent home in Week One and were due back Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> October which was last week. Thank you to all of the families who have already returned these notes. Please send this note to the office as soon as possible so we include your child in class structures for next year.

#### **NAIDOC Week**

Governor Philip King Public School acknowledges the original inhabitants of the Fairfield area, the Cabrogal clan of the Darug Nation. NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each year to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life (NAIDOC Week, 2020). This year, NAIDOC Week will be held from Sunday 8 November to Sunday 15 November. GPK will be celebrating NAIDOC Week throughout Week 5.

During NAIDOC Week, students from Kindergarten to Year 6 will learn about the significance of NAIDOC Week, participate in daily Acknowledgement of Country and participate in lessons based on this year's theme of 'Always Was, Always Will Be'.

Kindergarten will learn about the Traditional Owners and Custodians of Fairfield City and the connections Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have to Country. They will share and listen to stories about special places to them, their families and their peers.

Stage One students will learn how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are connected to, and look after, the land. They will share and listen to stories about places they feel connected to.

Stage Two students will learn about Aboriginal Astronomy and how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples use the stars to navigate. They will learn about the sustainable practices that were, and still are, used by Indigenous Australians and the innovations they first created.

Stage 3 students will learn about traditional bushfire management and how Indigenous Australians look after Country. They will learn about family relationships, kinship and how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples look after their community.

Reconciliation and the impact of British settlement is taught across Stage 2 and Stage 3 in the History curriculum. Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 respond to stories about family and places, and examine local sites. NAIDOC Week is a good opportunity to reflect on your child's learning of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures.

#### **School Travel for 2021**



#### 2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

\*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address.

Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

#### **New Concession Entitlement Cards**

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.

- Use an appropriate online (Gaming) name NOT their real name.
- Be aware of avenues for reporting internet abuse.
- Supervise and monitor use.
- Keep computer in a public area of the house.
- Be available, so that children can tell you of any issues they have with internet use.

- Your last name
- Your phone number (home or mobile)
- Your private email address
- Your home address
- What school you go to
- Sporting locations you attend
- Your parents work location
