

First Holy Communion Registrations



To order using the LOOP system:

- Sign in or register your account at <u>https://mybookclubs.scholastic.com.au/Parent/Login.aspx</u>
- 2. Click on ORDER
- 3. Select your school and your child's class

4. Add your child's **first name** & **last name** (so the school knows who the book is for) (PLEASE NOTE: Your child's details will never be shared with 3rd parties OR used for marketing purposes - this is for distribution purposes only.)

5. Enter the **item number** from the Book Club **catalogue**

All orders are sent directly to the school. Books will be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.
