

Attendance

What is an unexplained absence?

An unexplained absence is one where no reason has been provided for a child's absence from school. When there are a number of these, it becomes a concern for the school. GPK will follow its' procedures to follow these up.

What is an unjustified absence?

These are absences where the reason provided is not one that clearly explains or does not justify a student missing school. Examples of unjustified absences include travel during the term without seeking Principal approval, weather, siblings are staying at home sick and being tired.



Orders are due to Scholastic no later than Friday 17 June.

To order using the LOOP system:

- 1. Sign in or register your account at https://mybookclubs.scholastic.com.au/Parent/Login.aspx
- 2. Click on ORDER
- 3. Select your school and your child's class
- 4. Add your child's first name & last name (so the school knows who the book is for) (PLEASE NOTE: Your child's details will never be shared with 3rd parties OR used for marketing purposes this is for distribution purposes only.)
- 5. Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue

All orders are sent directly to the school. Books will be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.

Afterwards, there's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details back to your school!
