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Head Lice Check - They're back! Please help us by checking your child's hair. This is best done by combing through some conditioner with a fine-tooth comb. Check the comb with each stroke to see if there are any head lice present. Checking weekly will help us to keep them out of our school!! If lice are found please:

- Talk to the Chemist about an appropriate product to treat your child's hair and treat in accordance with the directions on the bottle.
- Remove all eggs (nits). This helps to ensure that you can more easily detect a new outbreak.
- Wash all hats, pillows, sheets etc.
- · Check your child's hair every few days after treatment to ensure that they have not been re-infected.
- Talk to the chemist and ask for a product with a different active ingredient, if you are having difficulty controlling
 the problem as Head Lice can develop a resistance to treatment products.

Congratulations!! Our school has shown a vast improvement in attendance of students each day. It is pleasing to see that students are turning up to school each day (apart from if they are feeling unwell of course). On top of that we have shown steady improvement with students arriving before class starts each day. Please remember that our bell goes at 8.50am, any student arriving after that time is marked as late. It is important to be on time and in attendance at school each day. Well done Governor!!


STRIKE! A fun experience for the children to make their way down to Bowlarama at Wetherill Park and enjoy game of bowling and play arcade games.
