- Don't miss out on important learning and messages by arriving late.




Deputy Principal's Message ...



Our 2024 Kindergarten students are one month into their educational journey, and they have been very busy. Look at some of the amazing learning experiences they have been engaged in...










Handwriting and Fluency

This program will continue every Thursday at 8:00am in Term One and will recommence in Term Four. If your child attends this program, please ensure they are wearing their Sport uniform every Thursday and have their school hat.

The K-2 Easter Hat Parade will be held on Thursday 28th March 2024. An invitation for parents/carers to attend this event was sent home earlier this week. All students need to wear an Easter hat which is made at home. This is an exciting opportunity for students to select their Easter decorations and make their hat with their family.

To order using the LOOP system:

- Sign in or register your account at https://mybookclubs.scholastic.com.au/Parent/Login.aspx
- 2. Click on ORDER
- 3. Select your school and your child's class
- 4. Add your child's first name & last name (so the school knows who the book is for) (PLEASE NOTE: Your child's details will never be shared with 3rd parties OR used for marketing purposes - this is for distribution purposes only.)
- Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue

All orders are sent directly to the school. Books will be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.

Afterwards, there's no need to return paper order forms or payment receipt details back to your school!

The Alexander house mascot: The Great White Shark.


These four characters don't have a name yet. Students chose these characters, and now we need our students to choose their name. This week, students will suggest names for our masects.
